Electric Fruit Juicer

This product is warranted for one year from date of purchase to be free of mechanical and electrical defects in material and workmanship. The manufacturer’s obligation hereunder is limited to repairing such products during the warranty period, provided the product is sent prepaid to an Authorized Service Station.

This warranty does not cover (a) normal wear of parts; (b) blender containers; (c) glassware breakage; or (d) damage resulting from any of the following: negligent use or misuse of the product, use with improper voltage or current, use contrary to operating instructions, or disassembly, repair, or alteration by any person other than an Authorized Service Station.

Return of the Owner Registration Card is not required for warranty coverage. This warranty gives you specific legal rights. You may also have other rights, which vary from state to state.

1. What parts and repair problems are covered?

2. Are any expenses excluded from coverage?

3. How long does the warranty last? _____
4. What will you have to do to get repairs?

5. What will the company do if the product fails?

6. Does the warranty cover consequential damages? Consequential damages are other losses caused by the product’s failure. For example, if the juicer breaks and fruit is damaged, the loss of the fruit would be consequential damages.
